

**Moreno Valley Animal Services
Summary Report – March & April 2019
Public Safety Sub Committee Meeting
May 21, 2019**

A. Shelter Services:

The following illustrates the number of positive outcomes of shelter pets during the months of March and April 2019 (family adoptions, pets rescued, reclaimed by their owners, TNR program, and pets transferred to pet adoption centers).

Animal Rescue Coordinator Update

The Animal Rescue Coordinator reported the following results:

The Animal Rescue Coordinator helped perform temperament testing on 139 dogs along with facilitating the transfer to our rescue partners the following 202 pets (29 dogs & 173 cats) that are difficult to place due to a variety of medical conditions or special needs:

B. Field Services:

Field Services operates on a 7 day, 24-hour response based on level of priority. Currently there are 7 Animal Control Officers along with 1 Animal License Inspector and 1 Field Services Supervisor serving the City.

Animal Control Officers rotate daily for Night Truck duty and remain available to respond to high priority calls after hours. During normal business hours, Animal Control Officers are available daily to respond to routine and high priority service requests. The Animal License Inspector conducts canvassing efforts throughout the City's many neighborhoods to inform residents of the legal requirement to have all dogs currently vaccinated against rabies and maintain current dog licenses.

Results of Pet Adoption Events

This year’s “St. Patrick’s Day” Pet Adoption Event was held at the Animal Shelter from March 12th – 14th and March 26th – 28th where 93 pets were adopted.

The annual “Save-a-Life” Earth Day Pet adoption event held for 6 days in April, resulted in another successful event where 90 pets were adopted.

Low-Cost Rabies Vaccination & Dog Licensing Clinic Results

On Saturday, March 2, 2019 and Saturday, April 13, 2019 the Animal Shelter held low cost rabies vaccination and dog licensing clinics at the Animal Shelter. Dog and cat owners took advantage of the reduced pet vaccination fees along with being able to renew or purchase their dog’s license as well as purchase a HomeAgain microchip for only \$10.
