# HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS

The Adopt-A-Trail Program is sponsored by the Recreational Trails Board in conjunction with the City of Moreno Valley. The purpose of the program is to foster volunteerism or sponsorship that reduces the cost of trail maintenance and encourages use of trails.

## Who can participate in the program?

Individuals, private corporations, service organizations, and nonprofit organizations.

## Can my organization adopt a specific trail within the City?

Yes, exact trail segment assignments are available on a first-come, first-served basis to provide an opportunity for all to participate. Waiting lists shall be established for segments with interest by more than one party. The agreement may be renewed as often as desired by the participant.

## What does my organization need to do to adopt a trail?

Applications may be obtained from the Parks and Community Services Department, Parks Maintenance Division, located at the City yard, 15670 Perris Boulevard.

## What is the term of our commitment?

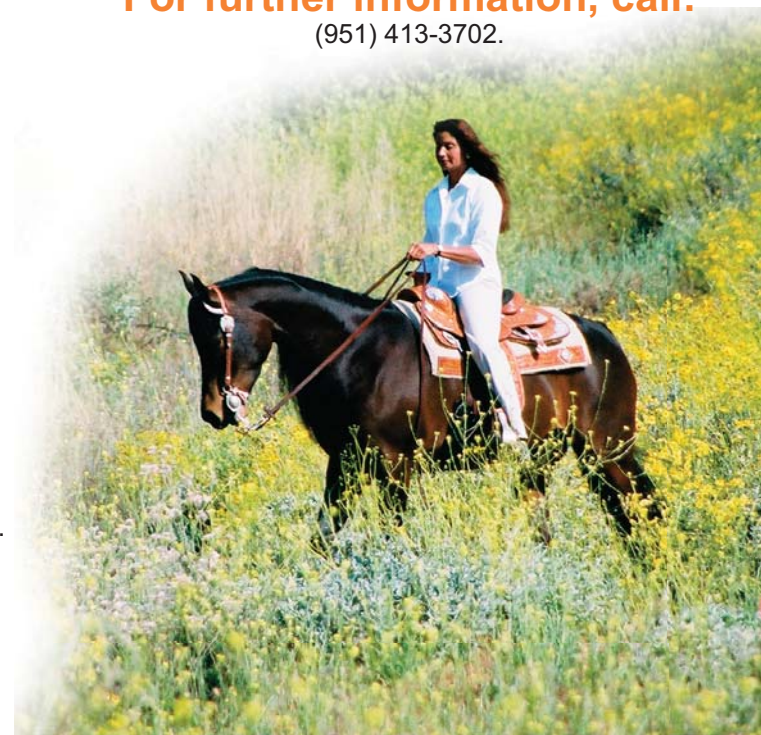
Before making a one-year commitment to remove litter and maintain the trail, first-time participants will be encouraged to maintain an assigned trail on a one-time trial basis. The actual agreement will be to remove litter at least four times a year, for a period of one year.
